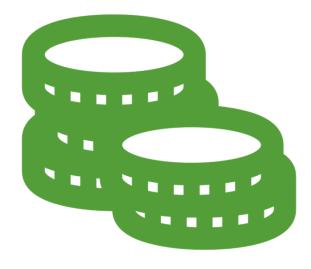

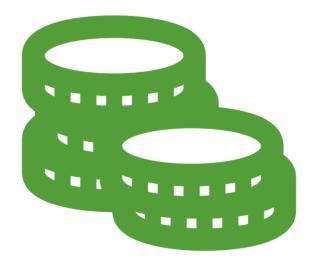




PROGRESS IN THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR

- South Africa's agriculture is export-orientated
- Export performance reflects increasing global prices) ۰ competitiveness of the sector's primary Billion (at 2015 products.
- Agricultural exports accounted for about 5.7% of total merchandise export earnings in 2022 ZAR I while the agro-processing sector accounted for 4.7% during the same period.
- The significant factors underpinning the ٠ increased export value are the sizeable agricultural output in the 2021/22 production season and the higher commodity prices.
- This is despite the sector continuing to ٠ struggle with poor roads network and inefficiencies in some rail networks and ports.

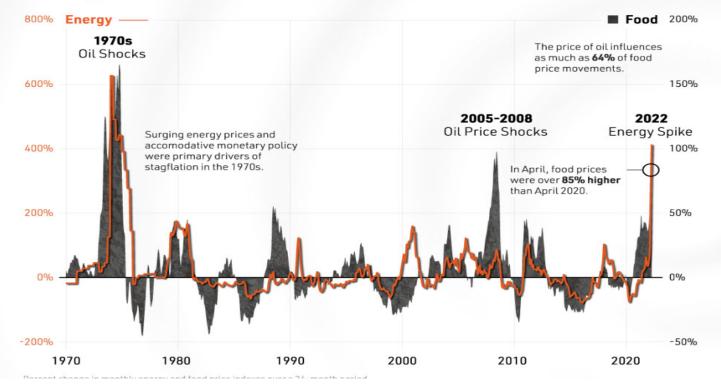

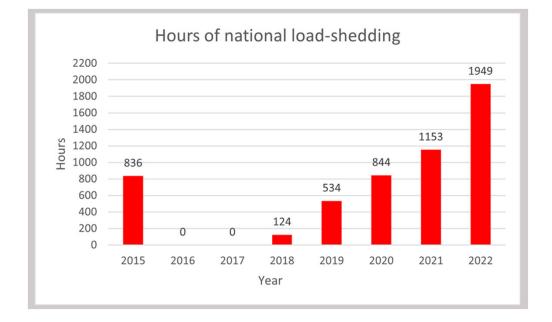

- 2022 has been South Africa's most intensive load-shedding year to date
- Eskom's coal fleet continues to deteriorate.
- Eskom had cut 2,276GWh of electricity in the first six months of 2022.
- More than 90% of the 2,521GWh it shed for the entire 2021.
- The country has experienced 1,949 hours (81 days) of national load shedding in 2022.
- This is significantly higher than the
 - I,153 hours over 48 days in 2021 and the
 - 844 hours over 35 days in 2020.

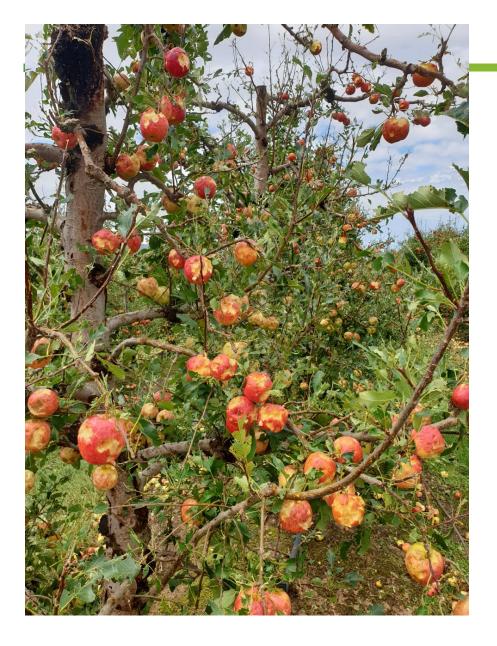

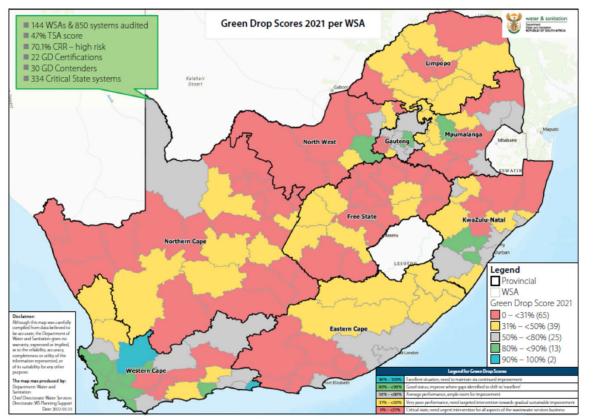

- The secondary and tertiary intercity road network is undergoing accelerated deterioration.
- The efficiency and cost of moving freight on the network face severe challenges.
- In addition, road safety is compromised by the condition of the network.
- The majority of roads authorities, provincial and municipal, do not have up-to-date knowledge of the condition of their road systems.

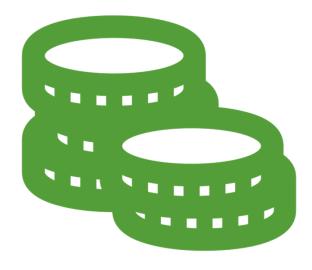


 The Green Drop Report 2022 provides feedback on the assessment of

- Only 23 wastewater systems achieved Green Drop Status.

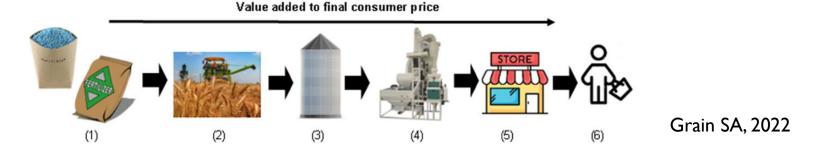

PROFITABILITY UNDER SIEGE!

ENERGY IS THE LIFE BLOOD OF THE AGRICULTURAL VALUE CHAIN



- **The input suppliers:** Companies that supply inputs, like fertilizer, seed and agro-chemicals needed to produce the raw commodities.
- The grain producers: Once the soil has been prepared and the necessary inputs have been acquired, then
 production can start.
- Storage facilities: Once the commodity is ready for harvest, producers transport the raw material to the nearest silo or miller.
- Processors: After the raw material is refined into the respective products, the miller either distributes the
 products under their own brand or sells the refined product to established brands
- **Retail:** The respective brands distribute the product to retailers and wholesalers.
- **Costumer distribution:** The retailers and wholesalers then distribute the product to the endconsumer.

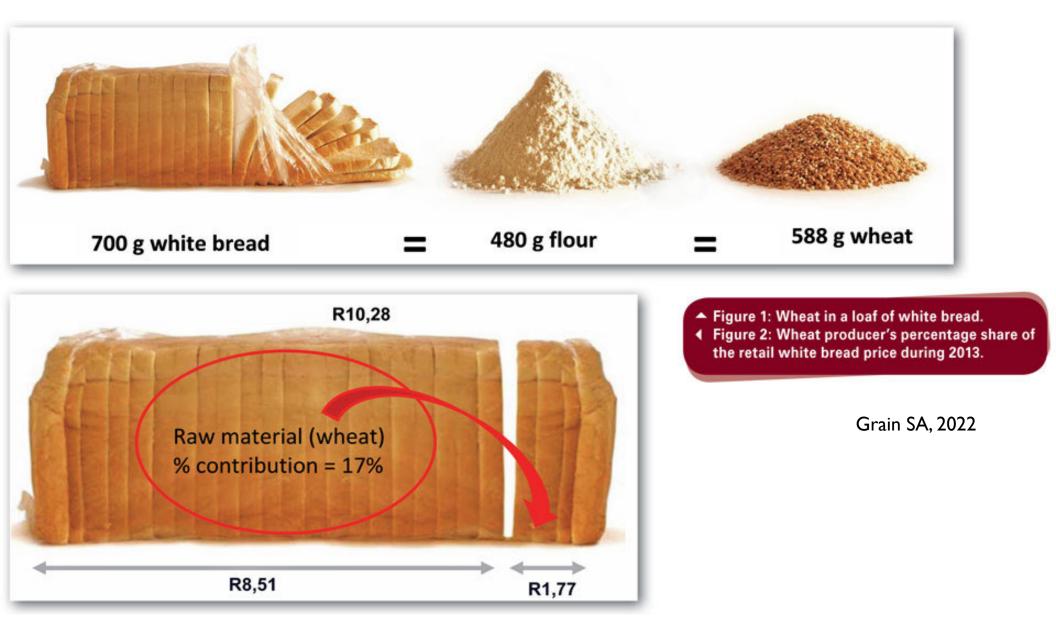
MAIZE PRODUCER'S PERCENTAGE SHARE

- For a 2,5kg bag of maize meal, the producer price only contributes (on a tenyear average) 51% to the final consumer price.
- The remaining percentages are contributed by value added through the value chain, this includes
 - packaging,
 - processing, and
 - milling-
- all of which requires energy and fuel, which had significant increase in 2022.





- For a loaf of bread, the producer price only contributes (on a ten-year average) 27% to the final consumer price.
- For a 750ml sunflower oil, the producer price only contributes (on a ten-year average) 49% to the final consumer price. Biggest contribution comes from the rest of the value chain.
- Each of these links are dependent on energy, and fuel costs to continue with operations.

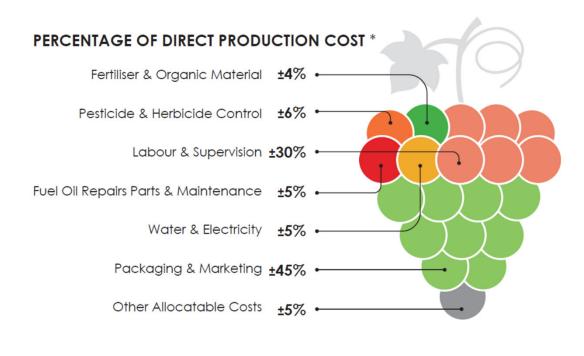

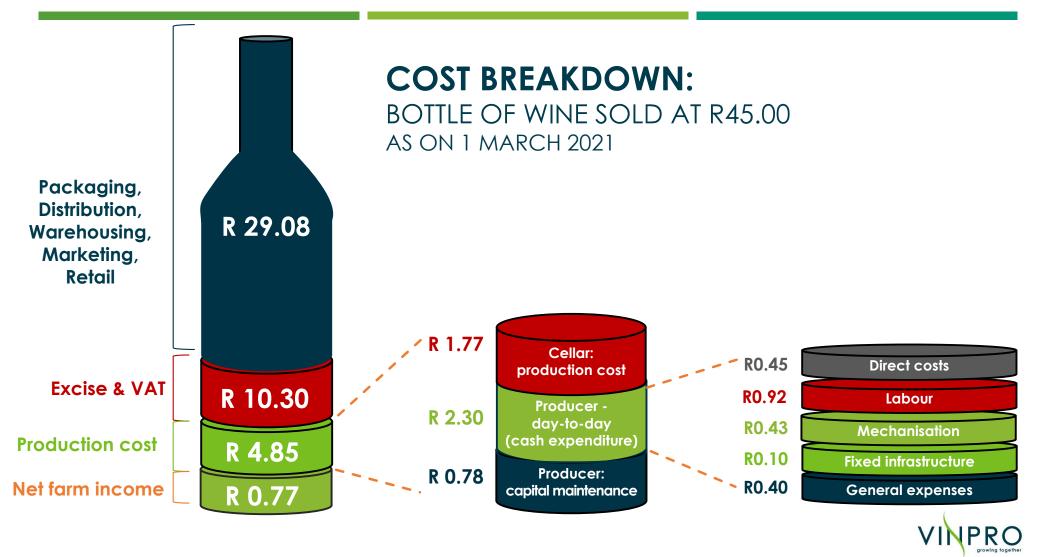

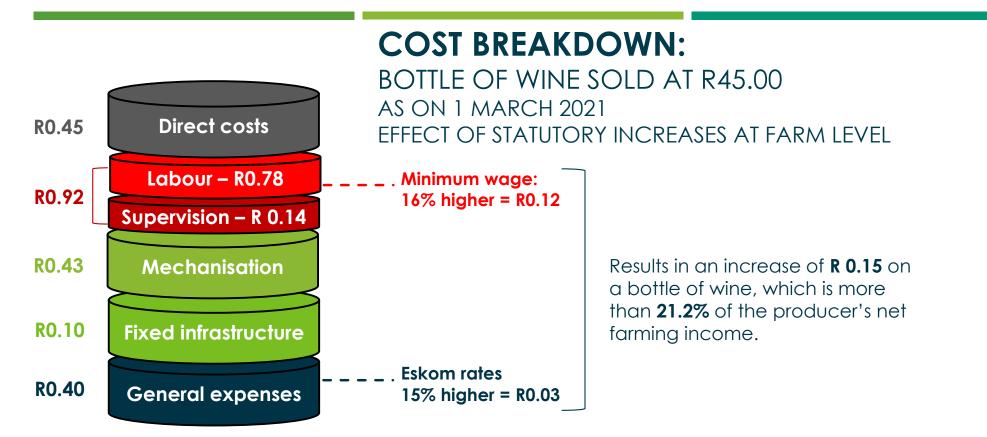
TABLE GRAPE INDUSTRY

- Producers have experienced intensifying cost pressure.
- Domestic fertiliser prices increased with between 102% and 179% from May 2021 to May 2022.
- Fuel (diesel) has increased by 57,5% during the same period.
- Cost of packaging material is expected to increase by 20-22%.
- Average cost to ship a container is now between 8 000 and 10 000 USD (R130 000 to R160 000) in comparison to only 1 400 USD (R18 200) in 2017.
- In the UK & EU (South Africa's traditional stronghold markets) grape retail prices have seen minimal to no increases in the corresponding period.



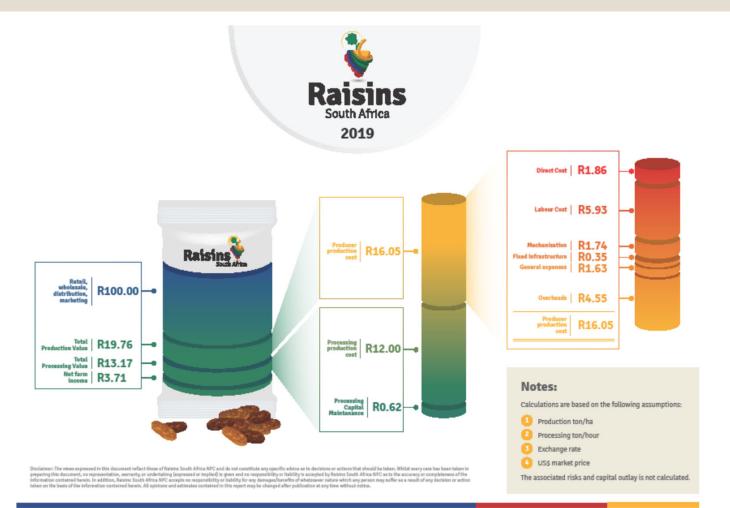

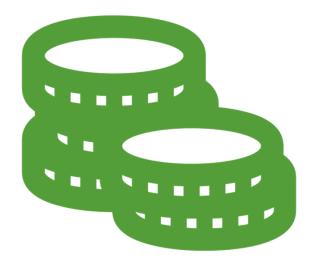

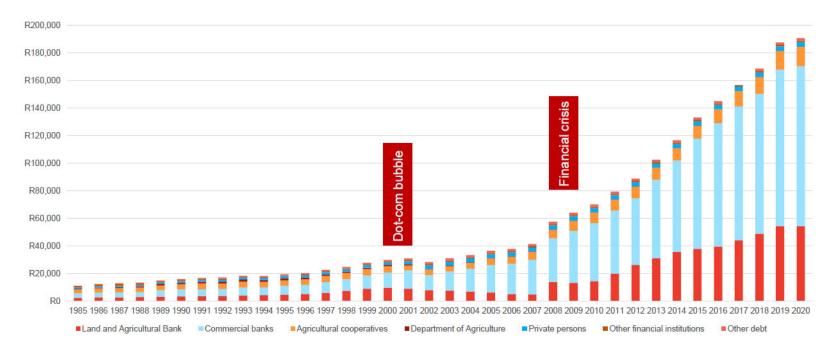




AGRICULTURE'S ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTION

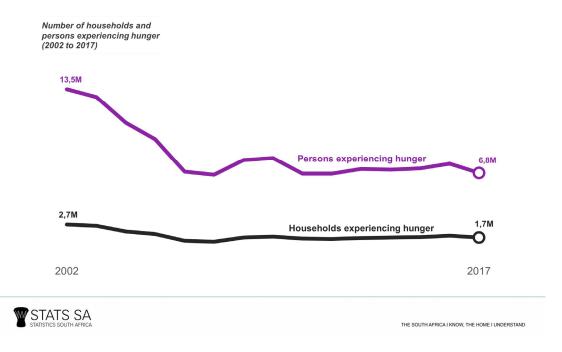
- October 2022 tractor sales of 1 268 units were significantly (48%), more than the 856 units sold in October last year.
- These sales are the highest monthly sales in the last 40 years.
- Year-to-date tractor sales are now approximately 20% up on last year.
- Thirty-four combine harvesters were sold in October, eleven units less than the 45 units sold in October last year.
- Expectations are that tractor sales for the 2022 calendar year will be of the order of 9 000 units and combine harvester sales 350 units.

ENSURING SOCIAL STABILITY!

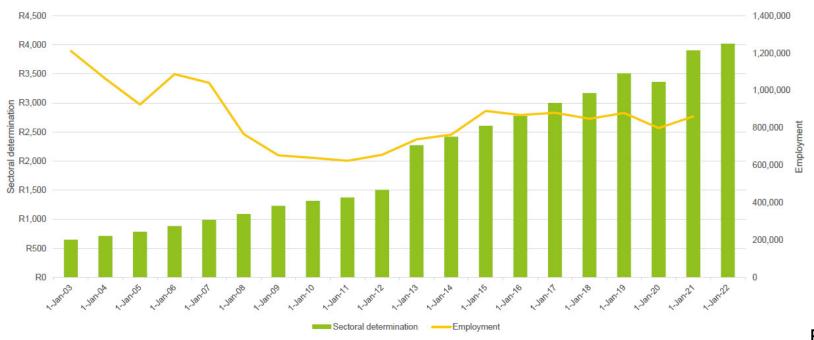
- South Africans experiencing hunger decreased from 29,3% in 2002 to 12,2% in 2021.
- Households who were vulnerable to hunger declined from 24,2% in 2002 to 11,6% in 2021.
- Limpopo (93,6%) and Gauteng (84,0%) had the highest proportion of households that reported adequate food access.
- North West (64,0%) and Northern Cape (66,5%) provinces had the lowest proportions of households that had adequate food access.

In 2017, 6,8 million South Africans experienced hunger. While the number has dropped from 13,5 million in 2002, it still affects 1,7 million households across the country.

ENSURING FOOD SECURITY!

- South Africa is ranked 59th out of 113 countries, an improvement in overall food security with a score of 4.6 points.
- Ist out of the 28 Sub-Saharan African countries with an overall food security score of 61,7.
- Quality and Safety score is 66.1.
- Sustainability and adaptability score is 56.9.
- South Africa maintains high levels of food safety and provides nutrient-rich food to consumers.
- Affordability of food has seen a decrease of 7.1 points since the 2012 GFSI

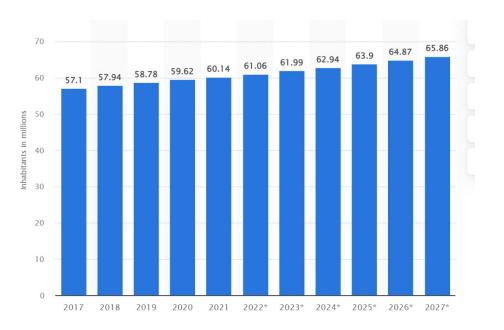
Global Food Security Index 2022: Scores for South Africa

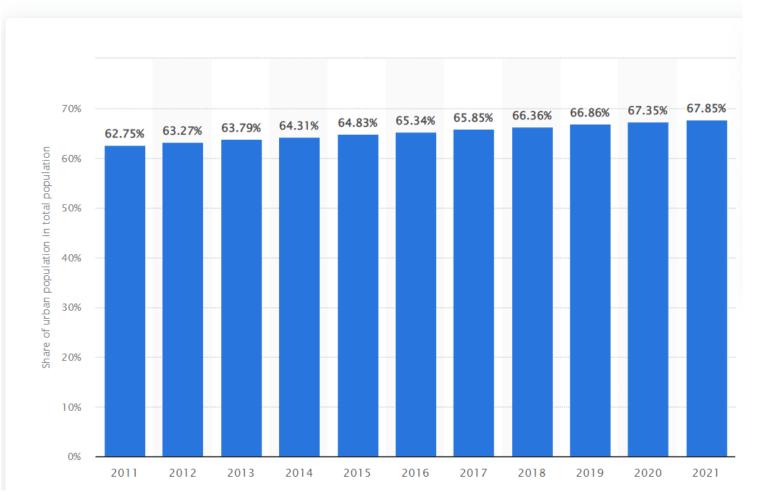
POPULATION GROWTH AND THE DEMAND FOR FOOD

- South Africa's population is growing at almost 2% per year.
- The population of 49 million in 2009 is expected to grow to 82 million by the year 2035.
- Food production or imports must more than double to feed the expanding population, and production needs to increase using the same or fewer natural resources.
- In addition, the demand for certain food types will shift as more people become wealthier.
- Commercial farmers have made great progress towards reduced reliance on state subsidies.
- Trade and marketing policy reform, has succeeded in transforming the sector towards greater productivity and international competitiveness.
- This has increased the market and climate resilience of the sector.
- However, headwinds ahead will affect profitability of the sector



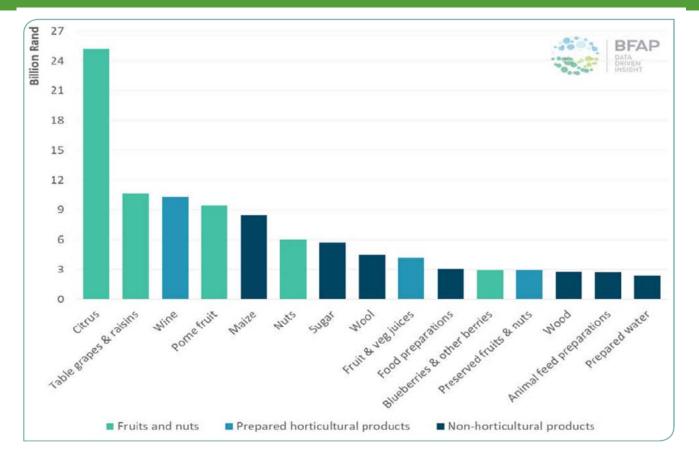
